The Valuable Gift of Life

Compared to women who have not been pregnant in the prior year, deaths from suicide, accidents and homicide are 248% higher in the year following an abortion, according to a [13-year study \(published in 2005\)](#) by the European Journal of Public Health) of the entire population of women in Finland. There are numerous studies like this showing the negative effects of abortion, but reports of the results are shunned by the media, universities, and even by professional medical and psychological organizations.

On Friday, June 27th, five members of the Gratia Plena team travelled I-45 to Dallas to hear psychologist and[Rachel's](#)

[Vineyard](#) founder Dr. Theresa Burke speak on several topics related to the healing of trauma from abortion. She pointed out that trauma is an issue not only for the woman receiving the abortion, but often for other family members as well.
